A CHRISTIAN IS A PERSON WHO HAS BEEN REBORN

John 3:3

Introduction: For pastors and other Christians, it is always exciting to see someone become a Christian, however, not everyone understands what all is involved but do sense that something meaningful is happening. Sadly, sometimes some Christians fail to appreciate the importance of being a Christian and as a result, they don't grow spiritually as they should. Jesus said that a person had to be "reborn" before he/she could enter into heaven. Just what is the importance and meaning of one becoming a Christian?

I. TO BE BORN AGAIN IS TO BECOME A NEW CREATION

- 1. A Christian is a "New Creation."
 - A Christian has risen out of the watery grave of baptism to newness of life. Romans 6:4-5
 - For a Christian, old things have passed away and all things have become new. 2 Corinthians 5:17
- 2. Becoming a "New Creation" is made possible by virtue of a "New Birth."
 - A new birth happens by responding to the Word of God. James 1:18; 1 Peter 1:22-23
 - A new birth is produced by the working of the Holy Spirit. John 3:3-5; Titus 3:5-7
- 3. Becoming a "New Creation" begins a life of renewal.
 - The "inner" person is to be renewed daily. 2 Corinthians 4:16
 - Renewal involves the renewal of a person's mind. Romans 12:2

II. TO BE BORN AGAIN IS TO HAVE A NEW LIFE

- 1. A Christian has passed from "death" to life.
 - Jesus promised those who hear His words "new life." Jude 5:24-25
 - Once "dead" in sin, the Christian is made alive to God. Ephesians 2:1-5; Colossians 2:12-13
 - A Christian has the promise and future of eternal life through God's Son, Jesus Christ. 1 John 5:11-13
- 2. A Christian has passed from darkness into light.
 - From darkness of not knowing God into the light of knowing God.
 - Jesus told Paul Acts 26:18
 - Peter wrote to Christians 1 Peter 2:9-10
 - Once living/walking in darkness, Christians can walk in the light.
 - They walk as children of light Ephesians 5:8; 1 Thessalonians 5:5
 - "Light" represents goodness, righteousness and truth. Ephesians 5:9; Colossians 1:12-13

III. TO BE BORN AGAIN IS TO HAVE A NEW LOYALTY

- 1. A Christian is a "converted" person.
 - 1 Thessalonians 1:9
 - Loyalties are changed:
 - From serving self and sin to serving God Romans 6:16-18
 - From serving falseness and idols to serving God 1 Thessalonians 1:9
- 2. A Christian is "converted" to the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - The Christian acknowledges the Lordship of Jesus Christ Acts 2:36; 1 Peter 3:15

- The Christian choses to follow Jesus over his/her family, life and self Matthew 10:37-39
- Upon making the choice to become a Christian, Jesus becomes the focus of one's life Galatiansa 2:20
- 3. A Christian's loyalty to the Lord Jesus Christ results in a "new life."
 - In the new life, God blesses through Jesus Christ the Christian Philippians 4:6-7
 - In the new life, one finds stength to liove that new life Philippians 4:13

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Some signifidcant things about a Christian is:
 - that he/she experiences a new creation.
 - that he/she enjoys a new life.
 - that he/she is involved in a new loyalty.
- 2. Sadly not all Christians show evidence of being born again why not?
 - Some may have not truly experienced being born again.
 - Obedience not given in faith does not produce the new birth Mark 16:16
 - For God's power to work, one must submit to Him in faith Colossians 2:12-13
 - Some may have indeed been born again and entered into the new life, but they may have gone back in sin by:
 - hardened by sin's deceitfulness, they have departed from God Hebrews 3:12-13
 - entangled once again by the pollutions of the world 2 Peter 2:20
- 3. When any Christian's loyalty is not where it ought to be, there is a loss of the things of God.
