THE CAUSES OF TEMPTATION AND WRONG DOING

James 4:1-6

(Not entirely original with me)

Introduction: Everybody messes up and does wrong things because of temptation. What causes all this mess? Before one can overcome his/her temptations and trials, he/she has to understand what causes them in the first place.

I. THE DESIRE (LUST) FOR PLEASURE AND GRATIFICATION

- 1. James 4:1
- 2. There is a constant warfare within each person, a craving, yearning, pulling, urging, desiring and grasping after whatever will satisfy/gratify one's pleasure.
 - Food and more food, drink and more drink, sex and more sex, possessions and more possessions, money and more money, property and more property, and so on and so on.
- 3. The result of mankind's constant "lust" is fightings and wars.
 - Peace is the greatest need of mankind.
 - Peace is not what exists between men and men or between men and God.
- 4. There is a difference between "desire" and "lust."
 - Desiring the necessities of life is good and God will provide those things.
 - Greed (lust) is the consumation of desires that are good for one's own personal gratification.

II. DISTRUST IN GOD

- 1. James 4:2
- 2. Desires are not met because one does not trust or depend upon God to fulfill what is wanted.
 - When God is ignored or denied, desires run loose and wild.
 - When God is shoved aside, man begins to do whatever he/she can to fulfill desires.
- 3. There are different lives of desires and lusts.
 - Some desire and do little if nothing to fulfill their deepest desires and just "wish..."
 - Some desire so much that they lie, steal, cheat to have what they desire.
 - Some desire so much that they are willing to go fight, go to war, even kill to have what they desire.
 - Romans 1:21-32; Ephesians 2:3; 1 John 2:15
- 4. There are several reasons why trusting and calling upon God is necessary to have desires fulfilled:
 - Man's deepest and most restless craving is actually spiritual, but is not realized at that time.
 - Man's spiritual desires and cravings cannot be satisfied with physical or material things.
 - Man is not able to control his desires, not completely, not always.
 - Man must learn to walk and talk with God, seeking and asking HIS opinion, His will, and His help all the time.
 - Romans 6:11-13; 8:13; Galatians 5:24; 1 Peter 4:2; 1 John 2:15-17; Psalm 37:3; Proverbs 3:5-6

III. PRAYAING WRONGLY

- 1. James 4:3
- 2. Most often prayer is made for things that will be used to gratify personal lust and pleasure.
 - Money to have more, success to be recognized, position to hold authority, health to go more.
- 3. Anything that would glorify God is the right motive for prayer.
 - Asking for health, must be in order to give God glory with one's life.
 - Asking for mobility, to be able to be active, must be in order to glorify God in what is done.
 - Asking for the basic necessities of life or advancements in life must be in order to glorify God with one's life and testimony.
 - Matthew 6:31-33; 2 Thessalonians 1:11-12; Ephesians 4:28; 1 Timothy 6:17-19

IV. WORLDLINESS - FRIENDSHIP WITH THE WORLD

- 1. James 4:4
- 2. In God's eyes, His family, being friends with the wold is the same as committing ADULTERY.
 - God's family is called the "bride of Christ" and to be friends with the world is to violate the bond that exists between the believer and Christ, thus "spiritual adultery."
 - Violating the "marriage" bond with Christ is to turn away from God and turn to such things as: money, possessions, lands, houses, position, cars, power, clothes, popularity, honor, fame, recognition, etc.
 - Spiritual adultery is:
 - Not obeying the commandments of the Lord.
 - Worshiping other gods.
 - Unclean works and sinful behavior.
 - Giving oneself to detestable and abominable things.
 - Forgetting God and turning one's back on Him.
 - Refusing to turn to God and not knowing the Lord.
 - Forsaking God.
 - Disbelief in Christ.
 - Being ashamed of Christ and His Words.
- 3. Friendship with the world is:
 - Living for this world and the things of the world houses, lands, money, position, anything that shifts focus from God.
 - The person who is a friend of the world focuses upon the world and not God, is an enemy of God.
 - Matthew 6:24; 16:26; 2 Corinthians 6:17-18; Colossians 3:2; Matthew 15:8; Romans 8:7-8

CONCLUSION:

- 1. James 4:5-6
- 2. The cure for temptation and wrongdoing among God's family :
 - Believers must realize that the Spirit of God is jealous over them and yearns for Godly trust in their hearts and lives.

- Believers must realize that God gives much more than what is needed when they depend upon HIm instead of themselves and the world to supply their needs.
- God has to stand against the sinner and his/her evil, whether it be one of His own children or an unbeliever.
 Anyone who turns to God away from the world and his/her wrongdoing will receive all the grace from God that he/she will ever need and then some.
