Luke 1:5-2:39

Introduction: Ah, Christmas! Everybody loves that time of the year. I. THE REAL BETHLEHEM ACCOUNT

- 1. It starts with the parents of John the Baptist, the forerunner of the Lord Jesus Christ, born six months before Jesus was born.
 - Zacharias, a priest met an angel while he was preparing to lead in worship.
 - Luke 1:11-13
 - He was told that he and his wife Elizabeth were going to have a son and to name him John.
 Both being old, he questioned the angel Gabriel and was then struck dumb and could not speak until the child was born.
 - Elizabeth did become pregnant.
- 2. Meanwhile Mary, Elizabeth's cousin, was informed by the angel that she was chosen to bear a son and that the Holy Spirit would cause it to happen and that her son would be called the Son of God.
 - Luke 1:38-55
 - Mary went to see Elizabeth to tell her what had happened and upon Mary meeting Elizabeth, the baby Elizabeth was carrying kicked in response.
 - Mary sang a song of praise to God for all that was happening.
- 3. Mary and Joseph journey to Bethlehem to be counted in a census ordered and while there Mary delivered her baby son. *(Luke 2:1-7)*
 - The baby Jesus was born as all other babies have been born.
 - Wrapped in swaddling clothes as was the custom and laid in a manger because they were having to stay in a stable and that was all that was available.
 - An angel appeared to shepherds who were keeping watch over their flock at night.
 - Luke 2:8-14
