# THE WAY TO CONQUER TEMPTATIONS AND TRIALS

### James 1:5-12

(Not entirely original with me)

**Introduction:** Trials and temptations are common to everyone: pain, death, hurt, sickness, greed, lust, disease, separation, accidents, divorce, disappointments, loneliness, loss, immorality, anger, emptiness, lying, etc. How does a person fight these things, and better yet, how can a person overcome such things in life?

### I. THE BELIEVER MUST ASK WISDOM OF GOD IN ORDER TO BE VICTORIOUS

- Wisdom is far more than just knowledge (knowing).
- Knowledge is grasping the facts.
- Wisdom grasps the great truths of life, knows what to do and then does it.
- 1. When the believer asks God for wisdom:
  - God will give wisdom and plenty of it.
  - God will not scold any of His children for asking.
  - God loves His children.
  - Matthew 7:24; Luke 21:15; Romans 11:33; 2 Timothy 3:15; Proverbs 3:13-14
- 2. The believer has the responsibility to DO something:
  - He/she must ask in faith and not waver.
  - He/she cannot doubt:
    - By wondering if God really exists.
    - By wondering if God is really going to hear.
    - By wondering if his/her request is in God's will.
  - God will not reward doubt with an answered prayer.
    - Matthew 13:58; Mark 4:40; Luke 16:13; Hebrews 4:11

## II. THE BELIEVER MUST BE HAPPY IN HIS/HER STATUS IN LIFE

- 1. If in a lowly status, the believer is still to be happy and rejoice.
  - NOT because of the status, but because of his/her relationship with Jesus Christ.
  - Christ has promised to exalt the lowly person.
    - Luke 19:17; 22:28; 1 Corinthians 6:2-3; 2 Timothy 2:12; Revelation 1:5-6; Psalm 91:14
  - Not to become bitter or allow circumstances to cause a sense of being inferior.
- 2. If in a rich status, the believer is to rejoice.
  - NOT because of what he/she has or who he/she is.
  - Status and wealth mean NOTHING to God.
  - The rich are no better off than the poorest in God's sight.
  - All stand before God as equals.
  - The rich are to rejoice because they are to help meet the needs of the poor with all that they have and all who they are.
    - James 4:14; 1 Peter 1:24; Isaiah 40:6-7; Psalm 39:5; 103:14-16

#### III. THE BELIEVER MUST REMEMBER THE REWARDS

- 1. The believer's life will be blessed:
  - Spiritual joy and satisfaction during his/her life here.
  - Satisfaction of security because God is looking after him/her.
  - Luke 6:48; James 5:11; Job 17:9
- 2. The believer will receive a Crown of Life:
  - A life that will go on, never ending.
  - A life filled with unbroken joy and rejoicing.
  - A life made into the image of Christ, Himself.
  - John 14:1-2; 2 Corinthians 4:17; Philippians 3:20-21; 1 Peter 4:12-13; 1 John 2:25
- 3. The believer who loves the Lord will endure the temptations and trials.
  - He/she will be faithful and obedient, doing all the Lord commands.
  - He/she will follow the Lord, never quitting, not matter how difficult.
  - Matthew 10:22; 1 Corinthians 15:58; Galatians 6:9; 1 Peter 1:13; John 14:21; 15:10

### **CONCLUISON:**

- 1. True, genuine salvation produces determination to last, hang on, to be obedient, to never quit trying to be like the Lord Jesus
- 2. What the believer lacks, God will supply abundantly and quickly when asked to do so in faith.
- 3. The believer is to be satisfied in whatever status he/she happens to be in life and to be quick to share with those in a lower status.
- 4. The believer is to remember what awaits him/her when his/her life is over.
