CHRISTIAN SOLDIERS

2 Timothy 2:3-4 Ephesians 6:10-18 Revelation 19:11-16

Introduction: Any American should be proud to serve our country in time of need and there should be very little sympathy for anybody who lives in this country, enjoys it's freedoms and then refuses to serve or honor our flag which is the visible emblem of what our nation stands for.

The same feelings should be expressed about those of us who live under the Christian flag. Let all of us Christians be reminded that we are at war but our enemy is invisible. Our God has an arch enemy and Satan is his name and Satan will do everything and anything to take God's place. Satan has an army which is made up of fallen angels, demons, followers and those whom he has deceived. God also has His army which is made up of angels and Christians.

I. WHO ARE CHRISTIAN SOLDIERS?

- 1. They are called (like Uncle Sam's pointing finger, but it's God's Holy Spirit), but are required to volunteer.
- 2. They enter service at different ages.
- 3. They serve in many positions with various duties as equipped by the Holy Spirit.
- 4. They remain on active duty until death (and only then become "veterans).
- 5. They are everywhere, all over the earth and in every nation.
- 6. They think differently than others (such as values and confidence).
- 7. They talk differently than others (such as subject matter, are lively and happy).
- 8. They dress in such a way as to honor their Commander in Chief.
- 9. They act differently than others (happy, calm, expectant).
- 10. They are eager to enlist others into the Lord's service.
- 11. They consider themselves a part of one big family.

III. SOME FACTS TO REMEMBER AS CHRISTIAN SOLDIERS
