I. PETITIONS IN VERSE 1

- 1. "Teach me to pray, Lord, teach me to pray..." (Luke 11:1)
- 2. "I long to know Thy will and Thy way..." (Romans 12:2)

II. PETITION IN VERSE 2

1. "O give me power, power in prayer..." (*Philippians 4:13*)

III. PETITIONS IN VERSE 3

- 1. "Renew my weakened will..." (Romans 7:25)
- 2. "Subdue my sinful nature..." (1 Corinthians 9:27)
- 3. "Fill me just now with power anew..." (Acts 1:8)

IV. PETITION IN VERSE 4

1. "Teach me to pray, Lord, teach me to pray..." (*Luke 11:1*)

CONCLUSION:

- 1. As a united expression of our need and in the assurance that our request is in line with the will of God for us, let's sing this great old hymn as a prayer "Teach me to Pray, Lord..."
- 2. Memorize the words, sing them over and over again day after day, let this be your daily prayer.
