THE BIG DEAL ABOUT THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

Deuteronomy 5:6-21

Introduction: Lately there has been much "ado" about the Ten Commandments being in public places such as schools, courtrooms and any government sponsored locale. What's the big deal?

- Those outside God's family see no need to have them.
- Many in God's family don't pay much attention to them.
- God gave the Ten Commandments to His people fresh out of slavery to give them a means of living in harmony with each other and Him, doing His will out of gratitude, love and respect.
- Christians are also expected to follow the same Ten Commandments as they are also part of God's family.
- The Commandments light the way, restrain from falling into sin, and show the standard to evaluate one's life and belief for God's family.
- What exactly are the Ten Commandments all about anyhow?

I. MAKING GOD NUMBER ONE IN ALL THINGS (Deuteronomy 5:6-7)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to let other things and beings take His place?
- 2. The world is full of serious threats to the freedoms of God's family.
- 3. Allegiance to God is the only means of remaining free from Satan, Sin and the World's grasp.
- 4. As God brought Israel out of slavery in Egypt, so He has brought the believer out of slavery from Satan, Sin and the World.
- 5. God is to remain "number one" because **HE IS GOD!**

II. GOD IS THE ONLY GOD (Deuteronomy 5:8-10)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to make images and things to represent how somebody thought He looked or to make up their own god?
- 2. Nobody knows what God looks like anyhow except His Son, Jesus.
- 3. Encountering the real, true, only God is life changing, such as Isaiah's encounter.
- 4. God needs no image to make His presence known, just look around.

III. DO NOT MISUSE GOD'S NAME (Deuteronomy 5:11)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to use His name any way one chose?
- 2. Names symbolize a person. How God's name is used reveals what one thinks about God and distorts God's image, abuses His authority, and presumes upon one's relationship with God.
- 3. How one uses God's name reveals one's respect, admiration and reverence of God.

IV. KEEP THE LORD'S DAY SEPARATE (Deuteronomy 5:12-15)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to use His Day anyway one pleases?
- 2. God intends for everyone to work six (6) days and rest one (1) day each week.
- 3. Everyday belongs to God in the believer's life and the work and it's results belong to God.
- 4. God intends for life to be balanced between work, rest, and worship.

V. GOD'S PROMISE: HONOR ONE'S PARENTS AND LIVE A LONG LIFE

(Deuteronomy 5:16)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to forget about one's parents and show disrespect to them?
- 2. God intends for children to take care of their parents when the parents are old.
- 3. Respect, honor and care for parents is based on an obedient attitude toward God, not so much on the character of one's parents.
- 4. God promises a longer life to those who obey this commandment.
- 5. HONOR ONE'S PARENTS BECAUSE GOD SAID SO!

VI. DO NOT COMMIT MURDER (Deuteronomy 5:17)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to deliberately take another person's life?
- 2. God did not place an age limit as to when life begins or when it is to end.
- 3. Man is not to willfully, deliberately take another person's life.
- 4. One may not have blood on his/her hands, but Jesus asks about "on the heart and mind?"

VII. DO NOT COMMIT ADULTERY (Deuteronomy 5:18)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to be unfaithful to one's own husband or wife?
- 2. Sex is for marriage! No discussion! No what if's! No exceptions!
- 3. Adultery is a violation of the most sacred of all human relationships.
- 4. Prostitution and homosexuality violate God's law about sex.

VIII. DO NOT STEAL (Deuteronomy 5:19)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to take whatever one wanted from others without asking?
- 2. Stealing is saying to God: "You don't know what I want" or "You haven't given me enough."
- 3. Stealing is the total disregard for what belongs to someone else and a disregard of God's direct command.

IX. DO NOT SPEAK A LIE OR SPEAK EVIL (Deuteronomy 5:20)

- 1. When did God say it was alright to lie?
- 2. Lying always is associated with sinning.
- 3. Distorting the truth, telling a story, white lies, fibs, half-truths, hypocrisy, gossip, even silence, and more, are all forms of lying.
- 4. God will not tolerate liars in His family.

X. DO NOT COVET (Deuteronomy 5:21)

- 1. When did God to say it was alright to want badly what someone else had?
- 2. To "covet" is to fix one's heart on something that he/she thinks he/she must have to be happy.
- 3. The world was never designed to satisfy everything or everybody, but to be enjoyed.
- 4. The believer is to have a relationship with God, not with the world and it's things.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. What's the big deal about the Ten Commandments? To the world, nothing.
- 2. To God's family, they are God's gift to them to help them be all God wants them to be.
- 3. The world offers easier "commadnments" to follow than what God has given.
- 4. Everyone is free to choose which they want to follow but the eternal after effects are vastly different.
