THE FIRST SEVEN DEACONS

Acts 6:1-7; 1 Timothy 3:8-12

Introduction: The Church at Jerusalem grew in a very short time from 120 to several thousand members. They had all things in common, caring for one another. A problem arose after a while. Some of the Gentile (Grecian) widows felt that they were being neglected but the Jewish widows were not. God had a solution.

I. EVEN MIDST PERSECUTION, THE CHURCH CONTINUED TO GROW

- 1. It seemed that the more the Church was afflicted and persecuted, the more it grew, multiplied.
- 2. The work of God cannot be hindered by people or even by hell itself.

II. AS THE CHURCH INCREASED, SO DID STRIFE AND DISCORD WITHIN

- 1. The Church started out with everyone of one accord.
- 2. Although the numbers increased, the joy did not.
- 3. Petty strife, fed by selfishness and pride, created problems.

III. THE COMPLAINT WAS, OF ALL THINGS, ABOUT MONEY

- 1. It is sad that insignificant things create most of the strife within the Church.
- 2. "...The love of money is the root of all evil..." (1 Timothy 6:10)
- 3. Most spats between husband and wife are about money/finances.
- 4. Most sore spots in a family have something to do with money.
- 5. Most Church splits begin with strife about money.

IV. NO CHURCH EVER HAS BEEN OR EVER WILL BE PERFECT IN THIS WORLD

- 1. Every congregation will eventually have problems to deal with and either overcome them or die.
- 2. Petty differences should never be allowed to break up the fellowship of a congregation of God's Family.

V. GOD ESTABLLISHED THE OFFICE OF DEACON TO DEAL WITH THE PROBLEM

- 1. Why was the deacon's office established?
 - Deacons are to relieve their pastors of all secular, worldly concern, so that they (pastors) might devote themselves entirely to the spiritual ministry of the Church family.
 - Deacons are to see that their pastors have no need to concern themselves with everyday affairs.
 - Deacons are to see to the material needs of the pastor, that the Church property and members are cared for properly.
 - Deacons are to distribute the Church's funds and to be servants to the pastor and the Church family.
- 2. How were the first deacons chosen?
 - The apostles called the leaders of the congregations together and instructed them to choose seven men of good report from among their congregations.
 - The seven men were ordained permanently to the office.
- 3. What kind of men were the deacons to be?
 - Not chosen upon the basis of friendship but of faithfulness. (Acts 6:3; 1 Timothy 3:8-12)
 - No man should ever be placed in this high office who does not meet the qualifications given in the Word of God.
- 4. What is the work for which deacons are ordained?
 - "Deacon" means "servant."
 - They are to serve the Church, the interests of the Gospel, and the pastor.
 - They are to relieve the pastor of the burden of caring for the material needs of the Church family.
 - They are to relieve the pastor of any burdens or cares that would in any way distract him from the spiritual needs of the Church family.
- 5. What affect did the service of these seven deacons have upon the Church?
 - The Word of God increased and many more were converted.
 - The Gospel was preached where it could not have been preached if they had not relieved the pastors.
 - The Church grew.

CONCLUSION:

- 1. Faithful deacons are an asset to any congregation and to the pastor's labors.
- 2. Together, pastors, deacons, and the Church family labor for the cause of Jesus Christ.
- 3. Those deacons who labor faithfully as deacons earn the respect and esteem of their pastor and their Church family.
- 4. Deacons were and are still GOD's idea of giving His pastors much needed relief and help.
