TURNING TEMPTATIONS INTO VICTORIES

1 Corinthians 10:12-14

Introductions: Would you buy a lottery ticket if you knew for sure that you would win? Why? As a Christian, expect temptations. Satan wants you to live a life of sin so you are useless in your Christian life. Overcoming temptations is something believer must learn how to accomplish.

I. SOME METHODS WE USE TO DEAL WITH TEMPTATION

- 1. Some simply give in to it. "If it feels good, do it. If it seems natural, do it, it must be right." Self-gratification is the way of life.
- 2. Some fight temptation with their own strength. In doing so they almost always fail.
 - Man cannot overcome his own evil nature.
 - One may hate what he/she is doing, but has no power to stop him/herself.
- 3. Some overcome temptation through the power of the Lord Jesus Christ.
 - It is no "dream." It can happen to YOU! It is how God designed it.

II. THE MATTER OF TEMPTATION

- 1. All of us are subject to temptation from the most "righteous" to the lowest criminal.
 - Jesus Peter David, etc. Everyone
 - Being saved does not make one immune.
 - Being tempted is not in itself a sin and each of us face temptations daily.
- 2. Pride, materialism, dishonesty, lust, greed, sexual immorality, etc.
 - Anyone who says that he/she cannot fall, then that person is headed for big trouble.
- 3. "If God really loves us, why doesn't He do away with Satan and stop temptation?"
 - Without opposition, there can be no victory.
 - God hasn't called us to a life of ease, but a life of victory in Jesus Christ.
 - There is such a thing as a "default" victory, however, and that is when the opposition doesn't show up, but Satan is not likely to not show up.

III. THE SOURCE OF TEMPTATION

- 1. "There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man."
 - Your temptation is not unique. Everyone has the same ones from the same source.
- 2. The Bible calls the "world" a system of evil and it is a source of temptation:

-"Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him."

- It is possible for Christians to become so much a part of this world that they don't stand out for God.
- Christians are of a different "mold." They don't belong to this world anymore.
- Don't accept the world's argument that you must conform to it's standards to be right, accepted, beautiful, cool, etc. Christians are to "come out of the world."
- 3. Another source of temptation is the flesh. Our body has the inclination to do evil.
 - Inherited from Adam, it is called the "old sin nature."
 - Satan doesn't MAKE us do anything. He simply tempts us toward sin.
 - We participate in sin all our own.

4. The third source of temptation is the devil himself.

- He is a real being, but uses our own natural desires to get us into sin.
- He is constantly looking for ways to defeat us, such as: suggestions, circumstances, anything to make it easy for us to sin.

IV. THE SEAT OF TEMPTATION

- 1. The Christian has three parts to his/her nature:
 - The Spirit, the Soul, and the Body.
 - Temptation comes in one or more of these areas.
- 2. The world tempts in the area of the soul: (mind, emotions).
 - The ego, self, the person who lives inside the body.
 - Ego trips, the worldly person, the desire to be somebody, to have more, to do more.
- 3. The flesh tempts in the area of the body: (comfort, satisfaction).
 - Lust, laziness, over-indulgence, sexual immorality.
 - David was tempted in the flesh more than once and yielded each time.
- 4. The devil tempts the spirit: (only the Christian has a Spirit).
 - Self-consciousness one's sense of God-consciousness
 - It is through the spirit that a Christian connects with God.
 - Satan wants to cut the Christian off from God. (Doubts, don't need God for this, etc.)

CONCLUSION:

- 1. To overcome temptations of the flesh, God says **RUN**..flee immorality.
 - Joseph ran when tempted by Potiphar's wife.
 - Flight is the key to fleshly temptations.
- 2. To over come the world, one needs FAITH.
 - If we love the world, we aren't loving God.
 - Love God more and the world's temptations will be defeated.
- 3. To overcome the devil, FIGHT. "...resist the devil and he will flee from you."
 - Satan isn't going to leave the Christian alone, bight in the power of the Lord.
 - Human strength is nothing to Satan, but the blood of Christ defeats him.
 - "Satan, I bring the blood against you. I resist you in the name of the Almighty. My body is the temple of the Holy Spirit and you're trespassing on His property. Be Gone!"
 - Bring the Word of God against him. Hold up your commitment to Christ.
 - Satan doesn't want the Christian to know what the power of the blood and the Word of God can do to him.
- 4. **FLIGHT, FIGHT, FAITH.** Flight from fleshly temptations. Fight against Satan. Faith against worldliness. YOU can triumph over your temptations.
