Psalm 19:1; 24:1

Introduction: Most people have never taken a good look at the world we live in. Most know a few scientific "facts" but just enough to pass an exam or to help their children in one of their science studies. Here are some commonly known things and then some rarely known things about the world our God has made.

DID YOU KNOW:

That the sun is 93 million miles from the earth?

- That the earth is in the exact orbit around the sun to cause heat and cold, night and day, summer and winter, fall and spring?
- That over 350 years ago a man named Galileo studied the moon in the sky through a telescope?
- That if we could drive to the moon in a car, at 60 mile per hour without stopping or slowing down, the trip would take 165 days and nights? If we left on March 20th, we would arrive on September 1.
- That all living things have ways to make more of their own kind, but that a rock cannot make more rocks?
- That the father sea horse carries the baby in a pouch on his front side?
- That people cannot change things? Soap changes when you wash, but it is still soap; butter melts, but it is still butter.
- That the General Sherman Sequoia tree is 30 stories tall (high) and right at 4,000 years old?
- That baby seals are called "pups?" Whale babies are called "calves?" Baby penguins are called "chicks?"
